1986	A 20-year rule by Ferdinand Marcos ended in 1986, when a "people power" movement in Manila		
	("EDSA 1") forced him into exile and installed Corazon Aquino as president;		
	Corazon Aquino's presidency was hampered by several coup attempts that prevented a return to		
	full political stability and economic development		
1992	Fidel Ramos was elected president;		
	His administration was marked by increased stability and by progress on economic reforms		
1992	U.S. closed its last military bases on the islands		
1998	Joseph Estrada was elected president		
2001	Estrada was succeeded by his vice-president, Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo, in January, 2001, after		
	Estrada's stormy impeachment trial on corruption charges broke down and another "people power"		
	movement ("EDSA 2") demanded his resignation		
2004	Macapagal-Arroyo was elected to a six-year term as president in May 2004		
Present	The Philippine Government faces threats from three terrorist groups on the U.S. Government's		
	Foreign Terrorist Organization list;		
	Decades of Muslim insurgency in the southern Philippines have led to a peace accord with one		
	group and on-again/off-again peace talks with another
