# Slide 4 PHOENICIANS WERE SAILORS Sailing No maps or modern technology Sailed beyond Gibraltar (Pillars of Hercules) Evidence that they may have circumnavigated Africa Slide 5 **PHOENICIAN COLONIES** Sailed and colonized throughout the Mediterranean beginning circa 1000 B.C.E. Gades (Cadiz, Spain) Carthage (Tunis, Tunisia) Modern DNA testing links Palestinians, Lebanese, and residents of old Phoenician colonies Slide 6 **TRADE** Leading sailors and traders of ancient world They traded: Cloth Dye (purple dye prized by kings, made from shellfish murex) Glass Pottery Traded for: Tin (Britannia) Hides, ivory, ostrich feathers, and slaves (Africa) Gold, precious stones, and spices (India)
