This map indicates modern state lines. Bear in mind that the United States was not officially formed with 48 contiguous states until decades after the conclusion of the U.S. Civil War.

- 2. Dred Scott was taken from Missouri, a slave state, to Illinois, a free state. Identify Missouri and Illinois on the map.
- 3. The Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo, signed on February 2, 1848, gave the United States undisputed control of Texas, established the United States-Mexico border along the Rio Grande, and ceded to the United States the present-day states of California, Nevada, and Utah, most of Arizona, Colorado, and New Mexico, as well as parts of Texas, Oklahoma, Kansas, and Wyoming.
